As many of you know, Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Season of Lent. It is a season of daily prayer, reflection, and fasting which prepares us for the Resurrection on Easter Sunday. Easter Sunday is the day we claim new life in Christ which He offers to all who would embrace the power of the resurrection.

Why we receive the ashes

Our foreheads were marked with ashes to humble us and to remind us that life as we know it passes away. The distribution of ashes comes from a ceremony ages ago.

The Ashes

The ashes that we used were made from palms used in the Palm Sunday celebration in 2014. While the ashes symbolize penance, they also remind us that God is gracious, loving and merciful to those who come to Him with repentant hearts. God's mercy is of paramount importance during the season of Lent, and the Church calls on each of us to seek mercy during this Lenten season as we reflect, offer simple prayers and fast.

I invite each of you to join me on this Lenten journey as we first experience Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday and then the glorious resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday morning. Please join me on this journey of redemption.

In Sunday school, not only are our children memorizing scripture, and bringing their Bibles, but I hear that they are asking their parents pretty hard questions! These little minds want to know! We are now making sure that we have Joys and Concerns for the kids before Sunday school starts each week. These small people are full of so many genuine joys, and concerns! They mean what they say, and truly want us all to pray together for them. My heart melts every week at just how precious these kids are!!

Jesus taught us how to pray when he prayed, "The Lord's prayer." However, I'm not convinced he wanted us to repeat it word for word forever and ever, amen. Don't worry, I dearly love repeating it just as it is in the Bible, (Especially with the kids in Sunday school,) but remember; Jesus was a teacher. He also wanted to give us a guide...to show us what bases are important to cover when we pray. Let me show you how I do it: The Lords Prayer: (Matthew 6: 9-13)

Our Father.
Who art in heaven,
Hallowed by thy name.
Thy kingdom come,

Thy will be done,

On earth as it is in Heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread, And forgive us our trespasses,

As we forgive those who trespass against us,

And lead us not into temptation,

But deliver us from evil,

For Thine is the Kingdom, and the Power, and the Glory forever!!!

Amen...

My Father and the Father of all,

Who is all around us..in us, thru us,

HOLY is your name!

The day is coming when we will <u>see</u> you rule over all the earth, sky, and heavens,

You have all power and glory and I honor your will for my life,

Over EVERYTHING!...right down to the smallest atom.

Thank you, Dear Lord for providing so much! Please forgive my sins, even those I did not in-

Please help me to forgive my brothers and sisters (ie: husband, wife, kids, neighbor, boss, inlaws, and road rage guy....)

God doesn't lead into temptation, (that always troubled me.) However, I take it to mean; Keep me strong in my faith, and knowledgeable to keep away from sin.

Put all sickness, hurt, meanness, envy; anything evil behind me in Jesus' name!

It's all yours God, I am all yours!!

(Amen means: Cut. Check. Print. Shut the gate, moving on. Signed. Sealed. Delivered! ... I think.);)

So the guide is simple:

Acknowledge that he is Personally your God and Holy Father

Creator and master of all things

Honor him with praise

Thank him for all he provides

Ask for that which you may need or want

Ask for His love and protection to guide, protect, and comfort you

Close with praise and adoration for all he has done, and in his name to seal the prayer.



I think God loves to hear how our minds work. He created us in his image with minds of our own. We are not his puppets. We are his creatures designed with free will. He loves to watch us create! He wants us to know that we can **choose** right from wrong. That's the whole point of it! We have the choice to believe or not believe; to hear and not hear, to think it all through scientifically...then spiritually, to pray or not to pray, to learn or not to learn, to grow in Him....or not to. He wants us to come to him of *our own free will*, and then to sweeten the deal, He came in the form of man, to guide us to his loving arms.

Once you start to understand what you are reading out loud together, then it's important to make God's word personal. To allow God in, and let him "write His word on your heart." Once you feel the Lord in your reading, and writing, you will understand and appreciate the guided praying we sometimes do in church. We read together to be of one mind. To honor God in one accord!

Luke 24: 8 "Then they remembered His words."

These little people in Sunday school are getting it! They understand the power of prayer and the absolute pure love that the Lord has for them. I hope you do too.
